Prize Money Breakdown

**NB. Prize Money Allocation*

- If a player/team withdraws from the Round-Robin phase before its conclusion, they will be replaced in the draw by the next alternate on the official entry list, who will play out the conclusion of the event. The substitute player/team will collect all prize money due. The withdrawing player/team will collect 50% of prize money due to the 4th placed player/team in the relevant group.
- If a player/team withdraws from the semi-final or the final, their prize money is calculated per the round they withdrew less 50% of the difference between that round and the previous round. Such 50% shall be retained by the Tournament.
- If a player withdraws from the singles final, and the Tournament Organiser so desires, a substitute player will play a best of 3 set exhibition match against the Tournament winner. The substitute player will receive 50% of the prize money due, and the withdrawing player will receive 50% of the prize money due.

Round Robin format

- The field shall be divided into two groups of four players/teams in each. The top-seeded player/team shall be placed in Group A and the second-seeded player shall be placed in Group B. Players/teams seeded three and four, five and six, and seven and eight, shall then be drawn in pairs with the first drawn placed into Group A.
- Each player shall play every other player in his group to determine the top two players/teams in each group.

The final standings of each group shall be determined by the first of the following methods that apply:

- Greatest number of wins.
- Greatest number of matches played.
 (Comment: 2-1 won-loss record beats a 2-0 won-loss record; a 1-2 record beats a 1-0 record.)
- Head-to-head results if only two (2) players are tied.
- If three (3) players are tied, then:
 - If three (3) players each have one (1) win, a player having played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two (2) players tied with 1-2 records; or
 - Highest percentage of sets won; or
 - Highest percentage of games won; a player completing less than all three matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two remaining players.

Round-robin Qualification/Knockout phase

For Premier Singles, Division 1 Singles & Premier Doubles, the following will apply:

- The winner of each group shall be placed in separate semi-final brackets. The runner-up of each group shall be placed in the semi-final bracket with the winner of the opposite group.
- The events shall be completed with a single elimination competition for the semi-finals and final.
- There shall be no playoff for the third and fourth place positions.
